Water Bottles:

Summer camp students will need a labeled water bottle to stay hydrated throughout the day. Water filling stations are available around campus.

Snacks:

Snacks are provided, however, campers are allowed to bring a snack if they wish. If your child has any food allergies or concerns, you may denote that on the Health Form during the registration process.

Drop Off and Pick Up for Summer Camp:

No carpool available during summer.

Registration takes place in Hollandsworth Commons beginning at 8:15. Parents should walk campers in the building where the camp leader will meet the campers and escort them as a group to the designated classroom or camp area. Campers should be picked up in Hollandsworth Commons at 11:30.

Student Conduct:

Campers are expected to be kind, considerate and respectful of their peers and teachers. Disruptive behavior will be handled by the teacher and referred to the Director of Summer Camp if needed. Continued disruptive behavior may cause a camper to be permanently removed from the camp without a refund.

Attire:

Students should wear appropriate “summer casual” clothes. We recommend students wear closed-toe tennis shoes and socks to camp for safety reasons.

Registration:

Registration is completed online. The registration process includes the collection of general participant information, the completion of waivers, camp/class signup, payment & fees. Please complete information requests and waivers fully. Please be very specific when it comes to food allergies and medical conditions. The health and safety of our students is our utmost concern. Registration for each class will close one week prior to the start date. This allows staff to properly prepare for class. Please contact Sandra Miller in the business office if you have any questions, concerns, late registration, or to add your child to a waiting list.

Cost:

Summer Bridge Book Camp - \$40 / day \$80 / week
(Please preregister to ensure adequate staffing)

Themed Camps - \$150 per camp

25% nonrefundable deposit is required at time of registration. Active Summer Camp Program will send an email reminder for final payment.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Does Summer Camp have a drop-off or pick-up carpool?

- A. No. Drop off time begins at 8:15. Parents should walk their children into Hollandsworth Commons to check in and meet the camp leader.

Q. Do students have opportunities to play on the playground?

- A. Campers will participate in a 30 minute break to eat a snack and play on the playground.

Q. What do students need to bring for camp?

- Water bottle
- Snacks are optional. A healthy snack will be provided.
- Sunscreen, hats, sunglasses etc.as desired (All Items labeled with child's name, we are not responsible for lost, misplaced or broken items)
- Camp leaders will communicate any items specific to the Camp.

Q. How is the camp day structured?

- A. Parents will be provided a detailed description of the camp, including a schedule. Schedules may vary depending on activities and weather.

Q. Will non-TST students be allowed to register for camps?

- A. Priority registration is given to current TST students and students enrolled for the 2024-2025 school year. Non-TST students are allowed to register if space is available.

Q. Why are there no camps scheduled for my 3 year-old or PK child in the month of June?

- A. The Martin Building is undergoing renovations and will not be able to host campers during the month of June.

Q. How do I register for camps?

- A. A link will be included in the Tidbits to register. TST uses the Active Camp Management program to manage our summer camp program.
