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SCHOOL HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY

Trinity School of Texas was founded in 1957 by the Trinity Episcopal Church as a coeducational day school through grade five. In 1984, the school initiated an expansion program which culminated in 1990 with the graduation of its first senior class. The Upper School program is college preparatory and coeducational, serving 61 students, with a total enrollment of 281. Trinity School of Texas is committed to outstanding academic achievement and personal development. The Class of 2025 has 14 students.

All courses at the Trinity School of Texas are taught at a high level of rigor. Grades in courses carrying the titles of AP or Dual Credit will be reported the same as other grades. However, the calculation of the cumulative grade average reflects weighted scores of 1.12 for AP or Dual Enrollment classes. Only coursework completed at TST and Dual Enrollment will be factored into the GPA calculation.

AP SCORES

68% of the Class of 2024 scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP test.
