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SCHOOL HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY

Trinity School of Texas was founded in 1957 by the Trinity Episcopal Church as a coeducational day school through grade five. In 1984, the school initiated an expansion program which culminated in 1990 with the graduation of its first senior class. The Upper School program is college preparatory and coeducational, complete with a robust course schedule featuring nearly 20 advanced placement course offerings, and a host of dual credit courses as well. The upper school serves 61 students, within a total school enrollment of 294. The upper school is currently recognized as an AP Blue Ribbon School, a distinction reserved for only roughly 30% of all high school campuses globally, for continued high student engagement in AP coursework and high AP passing rates.

Trinity School of Texas is committed to facilitating outstanding academic achievement and social-emotional learning within a joyful, spiritual environment. The Class of 2026 has 17 students.

Trinity School of Texas is accredited by Cognia (formerly AdvancED) and the Southwestern Association of Episcopal Schools. FACULTY

Trinity School of Texas' professional staff is composed of 40 certified educators, 45% holding advanced degrees. At the Upper School level, the student to faculty ratio is 7:1.

GRADING SCALE

All courses at the Trinity School of Texas are taught at a high level of rigor. Grades in courses carrying the titles of AP or Dual Credit will be reported the same as other grades. However, the calculation of the cumulative grade average reflects weighted scores of 1.12 for AP or Dual Enrollment classes. Only coursework completed at TST and Dual Enrollment will be factored into the GPA calculation.

AP SCORES

71.4% of the Class of 2025 scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP test. 43% of the Class of 2025 achieved the AP Scholar distinction. 76.5% of the Class of 2026 scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP test.
