JOB GOALS:

We are seeking a creative, enthusiastic, and passionate Elementary Music Teacher to inspire a love for music and the arts in young learners. The ideal candidate will design and deliver engaging, developmentally appropriate lessons that cultivate musical skills, creativity, self-expression, and an appreciation for diverse musical traditions. This educator will introduce students to a variety of foundational musical concepts, including rhythm, melody, movement, and instrument use, while creating a joyful and supportive classroom environment. In addition to classroom instruction, the Elementary Music Teacher will play a vital role in the life of the school by planning and leading musical components of key programs and events, including chapel services, Family Day, the Fine Arts Showcase, and individual grade-level performances.

This role provides additional opportunities to offer private lessons outside of the school day and to lead the Drama Club in the production of an annual musical.

- Design and implement a music curriculum aligned with state standards.
- Teach basic music theory, vocal technique, rhythm, instrument use and music appreciation.
- Encourage student participation through singing, movement, and music games.
- Organize and lead school performances, concerts, and other music-related events.

- Collaborate with grade-level teachers, arts team, and school staff to integrate music with other subject areas where appropriate.
- Maintain classroom instruments, supplies, and technology.
- Assess student growth and development in music through both formal and informal assessments.
- Communicate regularly with parents and guardians about student progress.
- Participate in professional development, staff meetings, and school events.
